Minutes of the Joint Meeting of the General and Executive Council of the National Law University of Meghalaya held on the 26th February 2025 at 04:30 PM at the conference room of National Law University of Meghalaya at Mayurbhanj Complex, Nongthymmai, Shillong-14.

- I. The 2nd Joint Meeting of the General (04th General Council) and Executive (05th Executive Council) Council of the National Law University of Meghalaya was held on the 26th February 2025, 04:30 PM at the conference room of National Law University Meghalaya at Mayurbhanj Complex, Nongthymmai, Shillong-14, in the presence of the following members and chaired by the Hon'ble Mr Justice Shri I.P. Mukerji, Chancellor of National Law University of Meghalaya.

 - c. Prof. D.P.Goyal, The Director, Indian Institute of Management Shillong
- III. The agenda items below which were placed for approval in the meeting had been agreed to in principle as per the details mentioned against each item
 - a. Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting of the Joint Council Meeting of the Academic, Executive and General Council held on the 05th of October 2023 (Annexure A)
 - i. The minutes were confirmed.
 - b. Confirmation of decisions taken by the Finance Committee and steps to be taken in its meeting held on 10th September 2024 and the items thereof.
 (Annexure 1)
 - The Vice Chancellor placed the minutes of the Finance Committee before the Joint Council members and highlighted only the agenda items below.
 - a. Agenda Item III. (iii) which is related to the payment of civil work where the Vice Chancellor mentioned that the costs of works carried out by the PWD, Meghalaya, were high. A question was raised if the amount was paid via University Funds, and it was clarified that the same was paid as part of the startup costs of the university-sanctioned by the Government of Meghalaya. The Council perused the documents but has not verified the financial estimate.
 - b. Agenda Item IV. (iii) which is related to the appointment of Statutory Auditor to which the Council agreed that the Auditor needed to be nominated by the office of the Accountant General. It was also decided that all accounts and expenses of the University should be internally audited by an Internal Auditor/Chartered Accountant (CA) which should then be audited by the Statutory Auditor appointed by the Accountant General. When appointed the

matter should be placed before the Council again.

- c. Agenda Item IV. (vi) "Procurement of Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR)" together with main agenda item I. (i) – "Approval for procurement of digital infrastructure, immersive lab, and high-end computational servers"
 - The Hon'ble Chancellor opined that the University should pay special attention to enroll more students in the different programme offered and set up Digital Infrastructure need based.
 - The Vice-Chancellor raised the issue that the University does not have the physical infrastructure to accommodate students (upcoming).
 - iii) The Chief Secretary, Govt. of Meghalaya, reassured that the premises occupied by IIM Shillong within the Mayurbhanj Complex would be vacated latest by April 2025. The Hon'ble Chancellor requested the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Meghalaya, to communicate officially with the appropriate authorities of IIM Shillong and its headquarters to achieve the results expeditiously.

RESOLVED that the Vice-Chancellor set up the Pre-Fab Structure, which has already been permitted.

That the Pre-Fab Structure will be set up and would be additional property of the University to the premises expected to be vacated and handed over by IIM, Shillong.

RESOLVED that advertisements for admission be published in print media [Local Papers (Both English and Khasi) and One National Paper] and digital media and to extend the last date of admissions for an additional ten (10) days from the initial last date, to get more students enrolled.

 d. Agenda Item IV. (vii) "Revised Pay Scales for administrative Staffs"

RESOLVED that a committee be constituted for this purpose.

 - a. The significance of high-value projects currently undertaken and completed by the University was impressed upon the Council members;
 - b. The number of papers published by the faculties in leading academic journals was also highlighted to the Council members.

3. Outreach and Engagements

- a. The Vice-Chancellor indicated to the Council Members that the number of international outreach programmes were initiated, though the same has been reduced due to space and infrastructure constraints; the focus is now on accommodating the domestic students.
- 4. Career Development Cell Report
 - a. The Council members were briefed about the student's internship activities.

RESOLVED, at the suggestion of the Hon'ble Chancellor, that the University should apply for a Three-Year Law Programme from the Bar Council of India."

RESOLVED, at the suggestion of the Council Members to request the Bar Council of India to nominate another official to be a member of the Executive Council and General Council respectively, considering the fact that the current member, Shri Manan Kumar Mishra, is the Chairman of the Bar Council of India, and may not be available all the time as an active member of the council.

h. Budget FY 2025-2026 (Annexure 6)

- i. The Hon'ble Chancellor raised the point as regards the high costs of development of the proposed IT infrastructures (Augmented and Virtual Reality, Large Language Model (LLM) Server etc.) and to whether proposals of such digital infrastructure at the proposed costs was justified in such a Law University in a small area with limited students. He also enquired whether the same was proportionate or disproportionate to the actual funds/budget proposed and the number of students.
- ii. While the Vice Chancellor was presenting the proposed Budget, the Chief Secretary of Meghalaya raised a point against the proposed costs of the Digital Infrastructure (Augmented and Virtual Reality, Large Language Model (LLM) Server etc.) which is quite high.
 - **RESOLVED** that the Vice-Chancellor shall submit a proper explanatory note on digital infrastructure, including why NLU Meg requires a highly configured server in the proposed budget to justify the

expenditure.

- i. Infrastructure Requirements
 - Space requirements for classrooms, student residences, faculty residences, guest house, and prefabricated structures
 - ii. Approval of prefabricated/modular structures within the temporary campus. –
 - The Agenda Item was NOT DISCUSSED separately, but references can be made to Section III. (b), (c), (d), (e) of these minutes for the same.
- j. Approval for procurement of digital infrastructure, immersive lab, and highend computational severs. (Annexure 7)
 - The Agenda Item was NOT DISCUSSED separately but references can be made to Section III. (c) of these minutes for the same.
- Review and approval of matters related to Service Rules, Regulations, and Reservation Policy (Annexure 8)
 - The Council Member, Hon'ble Mr. Justice H S Thangkhiew, stated that it
 is not acceptable that annexures, especially ones related to framing of
 policies and processes, are not provided beforehand.
 - A discussion in the meeting following assertions made by Hon'ble Mr.
 Justice H S Thangkhiew and supported by Hon'ble Justice W Diengdoh
 and Shri D.P.Wahang, IAS, Chief Secretary to the Government of
 Meghalaya,
 - a. That the reservation policy for the university should be 100% for permanent posts as per the Meghalaya State Reservation Policy, and it is non-negotiable.
 - b. That Unreserved (UR) as per the policy stands to be Unreserved for the domicile of Meghalaya.





- iii. The Chief Secretary, Government of Meghalaya noted that upon unavailability of domicile candidates for posts, "contractual" (tenured) appointments were proposed and approved by the previous Council. Hence, the hybrid mode of recruitment in "tenure" and "permanent" posts be promoted in the university. He mentioned that contractual posts (tenured) do not come under the purview of the reservation policy. The Council was, however, unanimous that balance and ratio should be maintained for the same.
- iv. The Hon'ble Chancellor suggested that whatever vacancies are available for recruitment should be advertised on a "permanent" basis, subject to the Meghalaya Reservation Policy.
- v. The Vice-Chancellor indicated that there might not be duly qualified applicants from the state domicile for the subjects and domains required in the university, and he also sought clarity on the existing faculties whose tenure will be ending in June 2025.
- vi. The Hon'ble Chancellor suggested that another advertisement be published out listing out requirements of faculties for particular subjects, which are required for six (6) months, with a clause that clearly states that the post is terminable on one month's notice, subject to selection of permanent/regular faculty.
- vii. The Hon'ble Chancellor also highlighted that long tenures couldn't be offered because that might lead to accusations of circumventing and supersession of the reservation policy.
- viii. The Hon'ble Chancellor proposed that the recruitment process be followed for the selection of permanent posts subject to reservation, and if proper candidates were not found to be eligible, then an expert committee should be constituted for domains and subjects that can propose recruitment in tenure.
 - ix. In view of the aforementioned, the Service Rules presented as Annexure 8 were not approved by the members.
 - **RESOLVED** that a committee be constituted to frame the service rules of the university. The committee will look comprehensively at all related aspects and implications of the service rules, including the reservation





policy of the State, maintaining the desired level of academic excellence etc. The committee should comprise the following members: -

- 1. Chief Secretary, Government of Meghalaya
- 2. Advocate General, High Court of Meghalaya
- 3. Director, Meghalaya State Judicial Academy, Meghalaya
- Vice Chancellor, National Law University of Meghalaya to be the convener.

RESOLVED that till the committee is constituted and framing the rules and regulations completed, all existing contractual (tenure) appointments will continue, subject to further decision of the Council.

- Approval of selection of Deputy Registrar on "tenure" as per Advert. No.: NLUM/09/Estt/Advt./2022/84 Dated 14th of April 2023 appointed on 19th December 2024 and joined on the 20th of January 2025. (Annexure 9)
 - i. The Vice-Chancellor highlighted to the Council members that "Clause 18: Powers of the Vice Chancellor" of the First Statute of the National Law University of Meghalaya was invoked while appointing the current Deputy Registrar for a fixed period in the interest of the administration, with the approval of the competent authority.
 - ii. The Hon'ble Mr. Justice H S Thangkhiew raised the issue that the appointment was not made according to the reservation policy and the selection committee that was part of the selection process was not constituted as per the Statute and also executive council representative in the selection committee was not approved by the Executive Council members.

RESOLVED unanimously after deliberating on the matter, that the appointment of the Deputy Registrar's should be subject to a fresh selection for the formularizing process to the post of which should be started with 100% reservation and until the selection process is completed, the current Deputy Registrar can continue to be in service. The selection process will be monitored by Hon'ble Mr. Justice H S Thangkhiew.

 - a. The Vice Chancellor indicated that according to the National Law University of Meghalaya Act 2022, the General Council should be convened by giving 15 (fifteen) days' notice in writing whereas the Statute states giving 21 (twenty-one) days' notice needs to be amended.

RESOLVED that the Statute be amended according to the Act.

b. The Statute provides to 'President' of the General Council, the National Law University of Meghalaya Act 2022 amended and provides the 'Chairman' of the General Council **resolved**, the Statute should be amended accordingly.

The Vice-Chancellor said all the reporting matters were taken as duly reported.

- V. Any other agenda with the permission of the chair.
 - a. The Vice-Chancellor brought to the Council members the University requirement for a full-time Registrar, which is a tenure position like the post of the Vice Chancellor. He also highlighted the need to decide whether the tenure should be 3 years or 5 years as per UGC guidelines and whether the reservation policy should also apply for the post.
 - b. The Vice-Chancellor highlighted that a Registrar with a background in academics needs to be appointed for the University to sustain itself. Some other members indicated that some National Law Universities have registrars appointed from the Judicial Services or the State Governments.
 - c. Regarding the template provided to the members on the table (Appendix I), members requested clarification on whether it was a uniform template followed by other National Law Universities, Law Schools and/or UGC, to which the Vice-Chancellor responded in the affirmative.
 - d. The members then deliberated on the selection committee to be constituted for the post, after which the Hon'ble Chancellor observed that the Vice Chancellor constitutes a selection committee subject to approval of the Council.
 - e. He also observed that the Vice Chancellor should circulate the appointment of the Registrar to members of the Council and if no objection or representation is received within 7 days, then the decision of selection should be final.
 - f. The term for the post should be three (3) years.

This is a tenured position for three years

- Regulatory requirements are ever-increasing and need a quick response.
- Capability of complying with the academic needs of the University in the absence of senior faculty.
- With the growing body of students, experience in handling the student's affairs.
- Handling the external bodies and following up with their requests.
- o Understanding the financial processes, planning, and implementations.
- o Efficiency to maintain overall administration and discipline in the registry.
- Insights in funding research and research management.
- o Ability to conduct outreach activities within and outside the country.
- Persuasive in raising external funds, which include philanthropic funds, CSR funds,
 Foundation funds and other governmental funds.
- o Capability of organising large University Events.

The Vice-Chancellor enlightened the members present that all payment towards the honorarium and other benefits of the visiting professors will be carried put from the funds generated by the University and not from the allotment received from the Government.

The chairperson also requested to be put on record that for all the programmes other than the regular expenditures of the University towards faculty and staffs' salary, maintenance and the like will be funded by funds generated by the university whether on received of grants, research projects, donations or the like. Application money obtained from aspiring candidates seeking admissions and university tuition fees obtained from enrolled students will not be regarded as funds generated by the university. However, the funds on such account for the first academic year of the university to the extent of 80% and the funds generated in such account during the second academic year to the extent of 70% may be utilized for financing the relevant programs as envisioned by the university. The position will be reviewed at the joint meeting of the Governing Body with the Executive Council after the end of the Second Academic year. It is hoped that by such time or soon thereafter funds generated by the university otherwise may be sufficient to meet the expenses of such additional programs. This was unanimously agreed by the council members present in the room.

- 9. It was also agreed by all members that any funds generated by the university by way of training programs, consultancy services, certificate/diploma/short term courses etc. will be treated as University generated funds.
- 10. The Chair informed the room that the Foundation Stone Laying for the permanent campus of National Law University Meghalaya will be tentatively held on the 30^{th of} October 2023 @3:00PMat the proposed site at New Shillong Township. The Chair also informed the room that all members of the three Councils will be invited for the function and arrangements will be made for travel and accommodation for the concerned members who require the same.
- 11. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by the Chair to all members present.



Minutes of the meeting of the Finance Committee held on the 10th of September 2024 at 03:30 PM in the Committee Hall III of Additional Secretariat Building, Government of Meghalaya Secretariat Hills, Shillong 793001.

- 1. The meeting of Finance Committee was held on the 10th of September 2024 at 03:30 PM in the Committee Hall III of Additional Secretariat Building, and chaired by the Registrar, National Law University of Meghalaya on account of unavailability of Shri Pravin Bakshi, IAS, Chairperson of the Finance Committee with the following committee members present:
 - i. Shri. R. Swer, Secretary, Finance (E) Department, Govt. of Meghalaya.
 - ii. Shri. Uttam Rai, Finance and Accounts Officer, NLU Meghalaya.
 - iii. Shri. Debu Lyngdoh, Jt. Secretary, Law Department, Govt. of Meghalaya
- II. The minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 07th of February 2024 were confirmed by all members present but suggestions against the below items were reiterated: -
 - Empanelment of Just-Trippin, Shillong 793001 or start-ups for accommodations in the country and travel agents for vehicles for faculties and non-faculties visiting/travelling for official purposes or university designated travel.
 - a. The Finance Committee reiterated that other tours and travel agencies should be empaneled by the University for the purpose of travel and accommodations as second options in case of0 unavailability of the first preferred agency. It was highlighted that the same can be done however, the empaneled agency Just-Trippin can be preferred as a first option since the agency has a good track record with other Government institutions basis the services they provide and does not pursue for immediate payment of raised invoices and bills.
 - ii. Proposal and quotation for additional "Admissions" module in the ERP
 - a. The Finance Committee acknowledging that there is an agenda point for the selection of a new ERP vendor in the meeting recommended that the University prepare a list of issues and complaints raised by the University to the current ERP vendor which have/have not been rectified by the vendor in order for the University to penalize/cancel the contract with the current vendor. The acting chairperson acknowledged that the same will be done.
 - iii. The proposal to activate online banking with an enterer and verifier for easier transactions for online payments for GST and TDS or tax-related purposes is approved.
 - a. The status of the bank accounts for GST and TDS or tax-related purposes was enquired by one of the members present in the meeting and on confirming that the accounts have not been opened, recommended that the accounts to be opened should be strictly zero.



balance accounts which should be used purely for GST and TDS or tax-related purposes and should be initiated only when required.

- III. The below reporting items were placed before the committee which were agreed to in principle by the members:
 - Payment of INR 4,59,020.00/- as renewal fee for "Mail Server configuration of Annual Microsoft 365 Licenses (Faculty and Students)
 - a. The Finance Committee requested the acting chairperson to check that the yearly renewal fee of the licenses needed for the university should decrease in the coming years as the same is only a renewal fee. The acting chair acknowledged the same and informed the members that the same will be looked into.
 - ii. Partnering with Axis Bank for educational loans to students.
 - a. It was requested by the committee members to enquire from Axis Bank or any other bank where the university has opened accounts if they can provide scholarships to meritorious students or under privileged students to which the acting chair informed that the matter will be looked into.
 - iii. Payment of INR 5,40,91,031/- (Civil Work + Electrical Work + Labour Cess), for Renovation, Repair and Refurbishing of Mayurbhanj Complex and Hostel (50 Bedded Barracks) for accommodation of National Law University of Meghalaya sanctioned as establishment costs.
 - All Accounts opened in the University should be put forward to the Finance Committee and Executive Committee.
 - v. Payment of remaining works from Auditorium Renovation Phase 1 Annexure 2
 - a. The Finance Committee agreed that the payment of the remaining works for the Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Auditorium renovation is to be released.
 - b. The committee also requested that all work should also be presented to the members with the status and progress of work.
- IV. The below agenda items were sought for approval from the committee which were agreed to in principle as per details mentioned against each item: -
 - Confirmation of expenses for renting new Hostel and furnishings required in the hostel – Annexure 3
 - a. The Finance Committee agreed to the expenses being incurred for renting the new hostel and its furnishings at Demthring, Shillong 793009. It is agreed that the advance amount of INR 28,80,000/-(INR Twenty Eight Lakhs and Eighty Thousand only) as requested and agreed by the owner of the building at a cost of INR 2,40,000/-(INR Two Lakhs and Forty Thousand only) per month without any applicable taxes can be released as advance payment to the owner for the first year only for the two year proposed leased of the building. The rent for the second year will be on a per month basis or as subsequently decided by the committee.



- b. The approximate cost of the furnishings without the IT Assets of around ~INR 37,90,600/- (~INR Thirty Seven Lakhs Ninety Thousand and Six Hundred) and the approximate costs of the IT Assets which include CCTVs, Internet etc of around ~INR 53,04,650/- (~INR Fifty Three Lakhs Four Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty only) have been agreed to and the committee members also noted that the actual final costs of the same might increase due to other requirements of both furnishings and IT equipment in the building. These items are noted by the committee to be rented from the empanelled vendor of the university and that a monthly payment over the course of two (2) years from the total amount of the overall furnishings including applicable taxes are to be paid to the vendor.
- ii. Appointment of Tax & Accounts Consultant for the FY 2024-25 Annexure
 4
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that the university float an expression of interest or a request for proposal as applicable for the selection and appointment of a new Tax & Accounts Consultant for the FY 2024-25 and that in the meantime till the process is completed the current consultant can perhaps continue subject to the decision of the university. Selection of empaneled list of consultants as listed by the Accountant General of India's office is also suggested by the committee.
- iii. Appointment of Statutory Auditor
- iv. The Finance Committee noted that a Statutory Auditor cannot be appointed as the funds for the university are Grant-In-Aids from the state government and the University will be audited by office of the Accountant General in due process as followed by the office of the Accountant General.
- Preparation of New Budget for FY 2025-26.
 - a. The budget as prepared and presented to the Finance Committee was considered approved subjected to the below recommendations:
 - 1. The committee also recommended considering the revised pay scales of the Administrative Staff as per Agenda IV. (vi), (vii) and (viii) if required before finalising the budget.
 - The committee also suggested to add on another head for expenditure on buildings, etc. for the new admissions i.e. for 2025.
- vi. Procurement of Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) equipment tender notice for setting up of the Immersive Lab at National Law University of Meghalaya Annexure 5
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended the procurement of the items of an approximate cost of INR 1,50,00,000/- (INR One Crore and Fifty Lakhs only) as highlighted in the budget estimate prepared in

Agenda point (iv) above but the same needs to be placed and approved by the Executive Council first before proceeding further.

vii. Revised pay scale for Administrative Staff. (Comparative Statement)
Annexure 6

- a. The Finance Committee recommended to keep the issue in abeyance for all highlighted staffs viz., the Junior Administrative Assistants (Level 6 of the Meghalaya Pay Scale), suggested for revised pay scale since most, if not all, staffs employed are under a two-year tenured appointment. The committee also recommended that under the completion of two-year tenure, and under recommendation for permanency for the staffs the university can propose the permanent appointment of the staffs at a higher identified pay scale. An internal recruitment advertisement can be prepared for the purpose of the same.
- b. An issue was raised by one of the members that the current structure of the University sees the post of Junior Administrative Assistants (Level 6 of the Meghalaya Pay Scale) would probably be promoted to the post of Senior Administrative Assistants (Level 12 of the Meghalaya Pay Scale) which is six-levels of a pay-scale jump from the initial level and should be considered. The committee members agreed that this might perhaps be an issue in the long run and recommended that perhaps another position in between the two positions can be created.
- c. The post of Assistant Accounts Officer (Level 11 of Meghalaya Pay Scale) was also highlighted perhaps to be a discrepancy in the scale of pay as it is a technical post but has a smaller pay scale than the Senior Administrative Assistants (Level 12 of the Meghalaya Pay Scale). The issue was noted by the committee members and suggested that the post should not be read together with the line of charge as other non-technical posts viz., junior administrative assistants, senior administrative assistants etc as the post is purely technical and has a different level of professional promotions. The committee also recommended the same course of action as highlighted in Point IV.(vi).(a).
- d. One of the members also highlighted the issue of the pay scale of the Medical Officer which the process of recruitment was completed as per the advertisement No NLUM/09/Estt/Advt./2022/84 Dated 14th April, 2023 with pay of Level 15 of the Meghalaya Pay Scale wherein both the selected candidate and the waitlisted candidate didn't accept the offer of appointment as per the result No NLUM/Rect/Md&CO/141/2023/558 dated 19th September 2023 due to a plausible reason of the pay being lower and the position being a "tenure" position. The Finance Committee recommended that the University decide on the pay scale, recommended to be at Level 10



- of the 7th CPC, to be offered for the post and directs the issue of the position being "tenure" to the appropriate Executive or Governing Council.
- e. The Finance Committee recommended that the university clearly drafts and finalises its Service Rules along with the classification of cadres for the highlighted issues to be resolved. The same and any other rules, statutes, regulations should be placed before the appropriate councils and authorities as laid down by the Act.
- Medical Reimbursement rules for permanent employees whether State or Central Rules to be followed.
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that the University frames its own Medical Reimbursement Rules for all cadres (as identified in the Service Rules, as highlighted in the agenda point above) as per availability of funds.
 - b. The committee also recommended, for both Agenda Points (vii) and (viii), to the acting chair that the University conducts a comparative study of other National Law Universities in the country preferably choosing at least two such universities from the Northeast of India and three to four from other parts of the country to understand the matter better and more objectively.
 - c. The same can then be placed in the next sitting of the Committee for a final decision to be recommended.
 - ix. Proposal for Group Medical Insurance Scheme for employees employed as "Tenure, Contractual" staff and Life Insurance Scheme for all employees including Students Annexure 7
 - x. Matters related to rent and furnishings of vacant rooms at the current Faculty Accommodation including License Fee from occupants. (Agreement Attached). Annexure 8
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that a license fee be collected from all new personnel availing furnished university accommodation. The current personnel already availing furnished university accommodation can be collected a license fee upon their tenure/contract renewal, when and if renewed.
 - b. The Finance Committee recommended that the license fee be at a certain percentage. The percentage will be based on the square feet area of the accommodation provided and the same will be charged on the Basic Pay or @ 5 %.
 - xi. Matter regarding NPS contribution by employer for permanent employees and Gratuity for permanent employees. As per Section 28- "Provident Fund, Gratuity, Pension, and other benefit schemes" of the National Law University of Meghalaya First Statutes which states:

"All permanent employees of the University shall be entitled to the benefit of the Provident fund, Gratuity and Pension in accordance with

such regulations as may be made on that behalf by the Executive Council and approved by the General Council."

- a. The Finance Committee recommended that the University registers with Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA) for the purpose of NPS contributions post which contributions for the personnel under permanent employment can be provided with NPS.
- b. The committee also recommended a committee to be formed within the University which will take care of all matters related to pensions and other benefit schemes.
- xii. Matter relating to procurement of Library Books and resources as per Bar Council of India mandate of approximately INR Fifteen Lakhs (15) only. Annexure 9
 - a. The Finance Committee unanimously agreed to the matter of procuring Library Books and resources as per Bar Council of India mandate and recommended the same to be procured from registered suppliers and providers of the resources as listed by Bar Council of India or follow due process for the same.
- xiii. Issuing of work order and expenditure of approximately INR 2,35,858.00/-(@Rs. 2700.00, 40 Nos. multiple RFID for NLU Staff & Rs 1827.00, 70 Nos multiple RFID for Students) as supply, designing and printing of smart, multipurpose identity cards Annexure 10
 - a. The amount for procurement of University RFID IDs for the students and all staff is noted by the Finance Committee, however, the members also agreed that the amount might change due to the increased number of students and staffs.
 - b. The Finance Committee unanimously agreed to the matter of procuring University RFID IDs for the students and all staff of the University but has recommended due procedure be followed for the procurement process.
- xiv. Procurement of one number Two Wheelers for official purposes.
 - a. The Finance Committee unanimously agreed to the matter and recommended due procedure be followed for the procurement process.
- xv. Procedure for empaneling the new Contractors. The University can also consider the option of procuring some items from GeM.
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that the University reach out to the Public Works Department (PWD), Government of Meghalaya, for a list of empanelled Class 1 contractors with previous work and project experience of minimum of INR 1,00,00,000/- (INR One Crore Only) and to empanel the same within the university.
 - The committee members expressed their previous bad experiences regarding the quality of items, works and services while using GEM



and noted that majority of local vendors are not registered with GEM and encouraged engaging and promoting local vendors and suppliers.

- xvi. Procurement of an electric vehicle for the University for logistic support to the Students within the University (Subject to the availability of Funds).
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that a 17–20-Seater Vehicle, preferably from the company "Foce" be procured for the same subject to the availability of funds. The members noted that an electric vehicle for the proposed capacity might not be available hence a non-electric vehicle be procured directly from "Foce" or any of the authorised registered supplier of the company.
- xvii. Travel Allowance for Finance and Accounts Officer
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that a conveyance allowance equivalent to Fifty (50 L) Litres of petrol be provided to the Finance and Accounts Officer.
- xviii. Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) for National Law University of Meghalaya Annexure 11
 - a. The Finance Committee, along with its observations at Point II.(ii).
 (a) recommended the university to consider the use of SAMARTH as the same is being provided by the Ministry of Education,
 Government of India and most, if not all, other Central Universities use the same.
- V. Other Matters
 - i. Travelling Allowance
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that State or Central Rules can be followed for TA and reimbursements for the same...
 - ii. Trainings
 - a. MATI in collaboration with MSJA
 - iii. A member of the committee highlighted the proposal for providing 'Festival Advance' and 'Children Education Advance'.
 - a. The Finance Committee recommended that the University follow and adopt the Government of Meghalaya, State rules for the same.

Welcome and Opening Remarks

• The meeting began with a brief welcome note from the Vice-Chancellor & Chairman of the Academic Council.



A. Confirmation of Minutes from Previous Meeting

• The Chairman reminded members that the last meeting was held on **9 February 2024 at 3:00 pm**. And further stated that according to the Statutes, meeting minutes must be signed by the Chairman for approval, through the Registry, to be confirmed in the next meeting.

B. Items for Approval:

i) Review and Amendment of Regulations

a) Amendments to the National Law University Doctor of Philosophy Regulation 2023

- Inconsistencies in the use of "candidate/candidates" changed to "scholar/scholars", which have been corrected.
- o The inconsistent use of "institute" corrected to "university".
- o Spelling errors have been addressed.

National Law University Meghalaya Academic and Examination Regulations 2023

- o Insertions added in Chapter 2.
- o The word "Senate" corrected to "Academic Council."

b) Programme Name Change as per BCI Recommendations:

- Bar Council of India (BCI) has recognized NLU Meg as CLE and in their correspondence has recommended changing the undergraduate BS programme nomenclature to BSc.
- Concerns were raised about the impact of the name change on the programme's practical components, credit requirements, and international recognition.
- It was suggested to correspond back to the Bar Council to explain that the present nomenclature aligns with UGC regulations and the programme's unique characteristics.
- The Council agreed to the correspondence to the Bar Council to request approval for the nomenclature use of BS.



ii) Introduction of a New Entrepreneurship Credit Course

- A proposal was initially received from government agencies to create a one-credit entrepreneurship course.
- The course will be open to all students of National Law University Meghalaya and select applicants and will provide one credit upon completion.
- The proposal was approved by the Council.

iii) Holiday Calendar for 2025

- The number of holidays and working days were discussed.
- The holiday calendar template was approved by the Council.

iv) Refund Request for a Cancelled Admission Due to Disciplinary Action

- A student's admission was cancelled due to disciplinary issues, and his father requested a refund of fees.
- The Council decided to refer the refund request to the Executive Council for a decision.
- The Academic Council also recommended that the UGEC, PGEC and the URC councils to prepare a refund policy and to consider implementing punitive/forfeiture measures for future disciplinary cases, potentially withholding a portion of the fees.

v) Faculty Advertisements and Tenure Clarifications:

- The BCI report highlighted the need for full-time faculty members, including Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors.
- Concerns were raised about the definition of "full-time" and its implications for faculty recruitment, retention, and service conditions.
- The existing tenure and promotion system, as well as reservation policies, were discussed in relation to the full-time requirement.
- The importance of attracting and retaining high-quality faculty was emphasized.



- The Council discussed implementing a tenure-track and tenure system with rigorous performance-based assessments and incentives, including increase of remuneration for high-performing faculty members.
- The Council proposed that one agenda point meeting of the Academic Council may also be convened, if necessary, to deliberate on the proposed service rules and regulations concerning the tenure and promotion system.
- The Council agreed to refer this matter to the Executive Council and General Council for further discussion and decision-making.

Faculty-Student Ratio

- The Bar Council of India's report raised concerns about the faculty-student ratio at NLU Meg.
- The Council defended the existing ratio, citing the specialized nature of the programmes, the high volume of research projects, and the need for crossfertilization of ideas. The current ratio being 8:1, which is well in keeping with the recommended 40:1 by BCI.
- The Council argued that a higher faculty-student ratio is necessary to support the university's ambitious goals and maintain a high level of academic quality.
- The Council agreed to provide detailed justifications for the existing facultystudent ratio to the Bar Council of India.

vi) Contractual Issues Regarding a Research Fellow

- The Chairman highlighted the matter of a research fellow, who was initially appointed with the expectation of enrolling in the PhD programme, failed to qualify for the programme and received poor student feedback.
- The research fellow's contract stipulated that enrolment in the PhD programme was a precondition for continued employment.
- Concerns were also raised about the research fellow's commitment to teaching and her management of research projects.
- The Council reviewed the research fellow's performance, including student feedback and project management.



• The Council decided to defer any decision regarding the research fellow's contract until further review and discussion, owing to her maternity leave status.

Discussion on Student Feedback on Faculty Performance

- The Council reviewed student feedback on faculty performance, noting concerns about teaching quality, timely submission of grades, and course workload.
- The Council discussed strategies for encouraging student participation in the classroom and improving faculty teaching methods.
- The Council noted that as per the regulation, all evaluation criteria and metrics are to be submitted by faculty within two weeks of the last date of the examination.
- The Chairman emphasized the high expectations for faculty performance and the importance of continuous improvement in teaching and research.
- The Council acknowledged the value of student feedback and its role in shaping academic practices.

C. Reporting Items:

i) Membership in Professional Organizations:

 The Council reported on NLU Meg's membership in several professional organizations, including the Association of Indian Universities, the Bar Council of India, and the International Association of Law Schools. Additionally, NLU Meg has registered with Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR) as part of compliance with UGC guidelines.

ii) Admission Updates:

The Council reviewed admission data for undergraduate, postgraduate, and PhD programs, noting the total number of applicants, admitted students, and withdrawals.



• The Council discussed strategies for attracting more students, including conducting presentations in district headquarters and targeting international students. Council noted that diversity is essential for the institutional growth.

iii) Admission Process for Academic Year 2025:

Entrance Exam Schedule

- The Council noted the entrance exam (MEG UAT, MEG PAT & MEG PET) date of **5 April 2025 at 3 pm IST** for national students and international students.
- The proposed date was selected to avoid conflicts with other examinations and holidays.

iv) Constitution of Committees: The Council noted all the committees.

- The Council discussed the need for improvement to cafeteria services, including an appreciation of the introduction of a new app-based system for ordering and payment. The CMS app allows students to view menus, place orders, make payments, and provide feedback.
- The Council noted the positive impact of the new system on food quality and student satisfaction.

HON'BLE MR JUSTICE INDRA PRASANNA MUKERJI

Hon'ble Mr. Justice I. P. Mukerji is a highly respected legal personality in India, who currently serves as the Chief Justice of the High Court of Meghalaya and Chancellor of National Law University Meghalaya. Born on September 6, 1963, he comes from a family

deeply immersed in the legal profession. His father and paternal grandfather were both barristers and senior advocates at the Calcutta High Court, while his maternal grandfather was a senior lawyer at the Kanpur District Court. He completed his education at St. Xavier's School and College in Calcutta and earned LL.B. degrees from both the University of Calcutta and the University of London through external examination. Enrolled as an advocate on July 2, 1990, Justice Mukerji practiced at the Calcutta High Court, focusing on civil law, particularly revenue and arbitration matters. At the time of his elevation to the bench, he served as Senior Panel Counsel for the Government of India and the Damodar Valley Corporation. In 2005, he also briefly taught at the National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), Kolkata, and was a member of the I.L.R. Committee of the High Court and the General Committee of the Bar Library Club.

Justice I. P. Mukerji was elevated to the bench of the Calcutta High Court as a Permanent Judge on May 18, 2009. On September 21, 2024, he was appointed as Chief Justice of the High Court of Meghalaya and took oath on October 3, 2024. His Lordship's distinguished career in civil law, combined with his contributions to the legal profession and academia, marks him as a highly respected figure in the Indian judiciary.

With greetings from its pristine glistening forest glades, untouched emerald hills, sanctified with its unsullied air, thawed hearts on the roller coaster roads flanked with sun-kissed waterfalls and forest pines, 'Scotland of the East' welcomes you to the National Law University Meghalaya (NLU Meg). Nestled in the city's heart, the dynamic campus offers one of its kind interdisciplinary programmes.

I have a dream to build a University which will have a modern outlook towards knowledge creation and skill generation and be commensurate with international standards in the interdisciplinary study of laws. To me, the law is an organic discipline and ever-changing with social realities and technological developments. Law Universities are necessarily think-tanks and the keeper of the knowledge for future norms alongside social development. Law Universities are the foundation for the legal system of any developed society. The future legal mind gets shaped in the fertile environment of Law University, which has a bearing over the normative and destiny of any well-governed society.

Today, one factor that is lacking in the legal education of our country is research and innovation, both in the traditional and emerging legal knowledge domains. Such research and innovation should be rooted in the Indian socio-economic realities and technological advancements to meet the needs of society. I believe that the creation of new knowledge through research should percolate down to the last stakeholder and contribute to the holistic development of life and living in our country. Universities of today should act as a think tank to cater to the aspirations of students, researchers, professions, industries, and societies.

While most Law Universities in the country achieve a standard in teaching pedagogies, legal research needs more intensity. The focus of legal research is mostly confined to documentary analysis and is too incremental. Multi-disciplinary, transdisciplinary, and action research are yet to be at the forefront of law schools. The relevance of these two is increasing due to the

fast development of technology and the right perspective; emphasis on innovation and intellectual property; financial assets and right perspective; the science of criminology, victimology and penology with criminal law; and constitutionalism and constitutional right interphase with the domain of technology, privacy in technology space, human genetics, constitution morality with changing pattern of social morality; data governance and corporate governance etc.

To compete with global legal research output and make legal research relevant to the contemporary society, NLU Meg will focus on evidence-based research and propose solutions commensurate with the country's needs. To this aspect, the portfolio of research in NLU Meg should be categorised into three broad segments; first, theoretical research for developing future framework of the knowledge domain; second, engaging in action research to solve the real-life problems; and the third, future research by adopting future-oriented research issues to respond to the challenges emerging out of the existing disciplines (e.g. arising out of all legal fields and more specific to procedural laws and governance, corporate law and governance, criminal laws and inland security, environmental governance, river basin management, use of lands, urban facilities and infrastructure etc.) or the future disciplines (e.g. AI and law, genetic mapping and regulation, data governance and corporate governance etc.)

NLU Meg will focus on developing micro-credit research-led courses emphasizing on contemporary requirements of the society, market, and practice; like text mining and content analysis in legal research, data science and legal computics, artificial intelligence and contract management. Eventually, University should introduce the trans-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary programmes like a Master of Science in Law and Finance; a Master of Science in Law and Technology; and Master of Science in Criminal Law and Internet Forensic, Master of Science in Regulation of Urban Governance and Infrastructural Issues; and Master of Science on Judicial Infrastructure and Management.

The COVID pandemic opens a newer vista of learning. Focus is shifted towards personalized learning with the migration of teaching to the online platform. There is a possibility of creating a simulated learning environment by adopting augmented reality, virtual reality and artificial intelligence. Studies from overseas universities projected its effectiveness in continuous learning, reskilling and upscaling.

NLU Meg will focus on learning outcomes instead of information over load to its students. Focusing on learning outcomes will orient the students with the desired skill required for the practice along with the industry amidst evolving political, social and economic realities. Learning outcome needs re-defining and recalibrating the teaching pedagogy, content delivery by the professors and assessment procedure continuously. I am mindful that many professors adopt this approach, but the institutionalisation of it will forge the University future-ready.

Microcredit courses and flexible credit systems, the newer approaches, are even recommended by the National Education Policy and I strongly believe that most of the values that are derived in personalised learning comes out of microcredit and flexible credit systems. The knowledge domain is changing very fast, so future generation has to come back to the University to reskill and upskill themselves as per the requirements of fast-changing

economic and social realities to keep them relevant in their practice and profession. So, microcredit and flexible credit system act as a stimulus towards the future course of learning into the focus segment, with less intensity of time in a cost-effective manner. The process is useful for young students and the elderly returning to the University for reskilling or upskilling themselves.

The University degree programmes are necessarily a packaging of the subjects which the University felt are relevant to the job markets. The education approach at NLU Meg will focus more on bespoking the subjects by the students to cater to the ever-increasing diversified need of the fast-changing society. Microcredit courses, specialised courses and research-led courses with a flexible option to choose for the learners [young students or even advanced learners] from the pool of subjects will help them plan their desired future careers.

The Syiemship of Mylliem in Meghalaya stands as a significant institution in the traditional governance and justice systems of the Khasi people. This research proposal aims to explore the evolution and current state of justice administration under the Syiemship, blending historical insights with contemporary perspectives. The study will focus on the pivotal role of the Syiem and traditional councils in upholding justice, resolving disputes, and maintaining harmony within the community. By employing a mixed-method approach including historical analysis and contemporary assessments through interviews and observations, this research seeks to assess the coexistence and adaptation of traditional justice systems with modern legal frameworks. The outcomes are expected to provide valuable insights into balancing traditional customary practices with contemporary justice systems, offering recommendations for enhancing justice administration within the Syiemship of Mylliem

5. Mapping of the Living-root-bridges of the Khasi Community: Conserving Meghalaya's Intangible Heritage through the Legal and Empirical Lens

protect living heritage sites by drawing lessons from indigenous practices and grassroots experiences. The research highlights the threats posed by unsustainable tourism, deforestation, and urban encroachment on these cultural and ecological landmarks. Through comprehensive field studies in the East Khasi Hills and documentation of customary practices, the project advocates for enhanced legal and policy measures. The objective is to establish robust frameworks that ensure the conservation of these unique heritage sites, securing their survival against growing environmental and societal pressures. This initiative underscores the importance of integrating local knowledge and legal mechanisms in the stewardship of ecological and cultural heritage

6. Domestic Violence in a Matrilineal Context: Investigating the Experiences of Tribal Women in Meghalaya

Domestic violence is a critical issue globally, affecting women in both developed and underdeveloped nations. This form of violence, occurring within the private sphere, typically involves individuals connected by blood or marriage. As per Section 3 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 'Domestic Violence' is defined as any action, omission, or behaviour by the respondent resulting in harms and injures, endangering the health, safety, life, or well-being (mental or physical) of the aggrieved person. This includes physical, sexual, verbal, emotional, and economic abuse. It also covers harassment for dowry or other valuable security, and any conduct that threatens or causes harm to the aggrieved person. The present study investigates the dynamics of domestic violence within the tribal communities of Meghalaya, a North-Eastern state in India known for its matrilineal social structure. Despite the unique societal framework where lineage and inheritance are traced through women, Meghalaya witnesses significant rise in the cases of domestic violence. Additionally, according to Darilyn Syiem, former Chairperson of the Northeast Network (NEN), despite taking pride in its matrilineal social structure, in many aspects, women in Meghalaya face even more precarious situations than those in patriarchal societies. She highlights a prevailing attitude among a significant number of women in Meghalaya who consider domestic violence to be a private issue between husband and wife. This perception contributes to the under reporting of such cases, as many women choose not to come forward. The same is corroborated by the National Crime Records Bureau Report of 2022 whereby Meghalaya

accounts for merely 1.7% of the reported cases on domestic violence in India. However, the ground reports from the Meghalaya State Women's Commission project a different picture whereby adequate stress is laid on the rising cases of violence against women in domestic confrontation. Despite the availability of extensive literature on domestic violence, comprehensive studies are lacking in understanding the dynamics of domestic violence within matrilineal societies, such as the Khasis and other tribes in Meghalaya, particularly in the context of coexisting patriarchal elements. The intersectionality of domestic violence, considering factors like class, education, ownership of property/wealth needs deeper exploration in the context of Meghalaya. Additionally, the cultural attitudes influencing underreporting of domestic violence have not been thoroughly examined. This highlights the urgent need for a critical in-depth analysis to understand and address the issues from a criminal justice perspective. Here, it is imperative to engage in direct, inperson conversations with the victims as well as the witnesses in these cases to gain an insight into their perspectives which should then be cross-referenced and validated with the input and viewpoints of the key stakeholders of criminal justice system, (i.e. the police, prosecution, and judges) who are directly involved in registration and adjudication of domestic violences cases and District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) who provide legal counselling and assistance to the victims. This research holds the potential to challenge the prevailing assumptions about matrilineal societies and contribute to broader discussions on gender-based violence and women's rights in diverse cultural contexts.

7. Khasi Language Learning and Phonetic Database Creation

The Khasi language, spoken by the indigenous Khasi people of Meghalaya, India, is a unique and vibrant part of the Austroasiatic language family, but lacks digital resources for learning and documentation. This project proposes to create a phonetic database and language learning tools for Khasi, employing both bottom-up (phonetic) and top-down (vocabulary-based) approaches. This dual approach is grounded in research on language acquisition, which emphasises the importance of both phonetic understanding and vocabulary building. A review of existing literature reveals a gap in comprehensive phonetic resources for Khasi, despite recent advancements in language processing tools and the availability of translated texts. This project aims to fill this gap by building upon existing resources and incorporating phonetic transcriptions and audio recordings. The project will achieve its goals by enhancing existing Khasi word datasets, identifying high-frequency words, creating a phonetic database similar to the "Oxford 3000" for English, and developing a mobile app and web-based dashboard for language learning. The

project deliverables include an enhanced Khasi word dataset, a high-frequency word list, a phonetic database, and user-friendly language learning tools. By creating these resources, this project will empower both native speakers and learners of Khasi to engage with and preserve the language's rich linguistic heritage. It will also contribute to the development of more accurate language processing tools and promote the revitalisation of the Khasi language in the digital age.
